

What's Included



The Premier Pet™ No Pull Step-in Harness is comfortable and does not choke or gag as it wraps around your dog's chest. Multiple adjustment points makes for an optimal as it Wraps around your dog's criest. Mortiple adjustment points makes for an optimal fit. One quick-release buckle makes it easy to slide on and off your dog. Two leash attachment points provide walking options. Front leash attachment reduces leash pulling, while the back attachment is ideal for more traditional use. For more control, use with the Premier Pet[™] Multi-Functional Leash. This versatile, double-ended leash includes two leash snaps that attach to the front and back of the No Pull Step-In Harness, allowing safe and effective redirection of leash pulling.

Fitting the Harness

- Unbuckle the harness and lay it flat on the ground. With your dog standing over the harness, place their left paw in the left loop and their right paw in the right loop (**1A**).
- Pull harness up and around the dog's body and connect buckle (1B).
- Adjust each strap for a snug fit. When fit properly only two fingers should fit between the harness and the dog...



To use as a standard harness, attach your leash to the two D-Rings on the back of the harness. If your dog typically pulls on the leash, he will likely continue to do so because of the "opposition reflex". Opposition reflex is the reflex that causes sled dogs to pull against pressure

No Pull Leash Attachment

Attach a nylon or leather 4-6 ft. leash to the D-Ring on the Center Chest Strap of the

Although the harness may have an immediate impact on your dog's pulling habits and it may be more manageable to walk him,

he may still pull some while wearing it. The harness is designed to redirect your dog from pulling and help achieve a loose leash walk. The front-chest leash attachment reduces pulling by steering your dog to the side and redirects his attention towards you. In addition, the Martingale Loop provides extra leverage for easy, relaxed control.



The No Pull Step-In Harness is a great harness for everyday use, including running or jogging. However, proper fit of the harness is essential to the overall comfort of your dog. Be sure to fit the harness according the fitting instructions. If your dog begins to chafe, stop using the harness and consult your veterinarian.

Tips & Maintenance

- We suggest using only the back leash attachment when running. A leash attached to the center chest strap during running could accidentally trip your dog.
- Check the harness regularly, especially on growing dogs. Over time and after multiple uses the harness may stretch or adjust.
- For more control, use with the Premier Pet™ Multi-Functional Leash. This versatile, double-ended leash includes two leash snaps that attach to the front and back of the No Pull Step-In Harness, allowing safe and effective redirection of leash pulling.
- When not in use, safely store the harness.
- We don't recommend using a retractable leash with the no pull function, as the constant tension could encourage the dog to pull.
- Examine the harness for signs of chewing, fraying or damage.
